

## KEITH GOODRICH CASE

Keith Goodrich Case was born 17 August 1919 in Mt. Emmons, Duchesne, Utah. He was the second child of Floyd Henry Case and Edith Goodrich and the only boy among six children. He died 14 July 1945.

Keith was always a good boy, very obedient to his parents, serious about his church obligations and a good student in school. He graduated from Altamont High School in 1937 and attended the BYU in Provo for three years. He left school to fulfill an LDS mission in the Central States. During the last seven months of his mission he presided over the Independence District.

While Keith was in the mission field World War II broke out, so upon his return he enlisted in the Army Air Corps. He received training at Sheppard Field, Texas; Washington State College in Fullman, Washington; Santa Ana, California; and Hondo, Texas. He graduated from the AAF Navigation School at Hondo in January 1945 and was sent to India where he was attached to the Twentieth Bombing Command. His squadron was engaged in flying supplies into China and later to Okinawa.

His plane was returning to India after one of these missions and it was last seen leaving Bhamo, Burma after a refueling stop. This was July 14, 1945. Neither the plane nor any of the crew were ever found.
