

ALBERT GARDNER GOODRICH OBITUARY

Albert Goodrich Funeral Rites Held Wednesday.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at 10 a.m. in Moses Lake, Washington for Albert G. Goodrich, 92, formerly of Vernal.

Mr. Goodrich died Monday morning in a Moses Lake hospital following a stroke. He had recently undergone surgery.

At the time of his death he was serving as stake patriarch.

Mr. Goodrich was a former bishop of Naples Ward and was a one-time member of Uintah Stake Presidency.

He was a carpernter by trade and later supervised the construction of LDS chapels, some of which were in the Vernal area.

Mr. Goodrich was born May 1, 1871, in a dugout at Long Valley at Mt. Carmel, Kane County. At the time of his birth his parents, George A. and Harriett Maria Taggart Goodrich, were returning home from the well-known "Muddy Mission."

Surviving sons and daughters include Albert M., Karl, Merrell, and Ruth Goodrich, all of Moses Lake; Frank, Orem and O'Donnell, Provo.

The following brothers and sisiters also survive: Mrs. Elmer (Lucy) Lind, Maeser; Mrs. Joseph H. (Vilate) Bodily and Byron Goodrich, Vernal; Mrs. Elmer (Leona) Manwaring and Arthur, Salt Lake City; Mrs. Floyd (Edith) Case, Altamont; Mrs. Arvill (Ruth) Stone, Lehi and Leslie and John Goodrich, Bluebell.
