

ARVIL HANCOCK GOODRICH OBITUARY

Arvil H. Goodrich, 49, of 1343 East Alameda Road, died Sunday at his home following an extended illness.

Mr. Goodrich was born December 27, 1917, in Bluebell, Utah, a son of Alfred S. and Sylvia Ann Hancock Goodrich.

He married De Esta Mae Walker November 15, 1939 in the Salt Lake Temple.

Mr. Goodrich was reared in Bluebell, Utah. He lived there until he was married, then he lived in Roberts for a short time before coming to Pocatello. He worked for Ralston-Purina Company for 21 years, and the past five years was employed at Block's men's store.

Mr. Goodrich was a high priest in the 34th Ward, Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. While in the Fifth Ward he had served in the Sunday School and as YMMIA superintendent there and in the 22nd Ward for several years.

Mr. Goodrich enjoyed sports, hunting, fishing and gardening.

A son preceded him in death.
