

## BARBARA ELOISE GOODRICH OBITUARY

### FIVE-MONTH-OLD CHILD OF ALBERT M. GOODRICH SUCCUMBS AFTER ILLNESS

NAPLES-- (Special) -- The community was grieved to learn of the sudden death of Barbara Eloise, the five month old baby daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Albert M. Goodrich who passed away at 11:30 a.m. Sunday May 10 after a brief illness of a few hours. Doctors are unable to determine the cause of death as the child was apparently as well as usual the previous evening but became ill during the night and suffered intensely until death came to relieve her the following day.

Barbara Eloise was the child of Albert M. and Melinda Starkie Goodrich and was born December 26, 1930. Beside her parents and her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. E. C. Starke and family and Mr. and Mrs. A. Goodrich and family, one brother, Kenneth and two sisters Lenore and Grace are left to mourn her loss.

Impressive funeral services were held Monday May 11 at 1 p.m. in the Naples Ward Chapel. The services were conducted by counselor LeVelle Manwaring. A double mixed quartet sang, "I know That My Redeemer Liveth: and Sometime, Somewhere." Driver E. Gardiner offered the invocation. Lewis S. Gardiner spoke peace to the hearts of the bereaved in their faith in the gospel and promised them that through righteous living they would be permitted to again meet their infant child and have the priveledge of rearing them in the world to come.

Lavelle Manwaring spoke of his associations with the parents of the child and of their faithful endeavors in the organizations of the church. In behalf of the family he thanked all who assisted in any way during the sickness and death of the child and for the profusion of beautiful floral offerings. The esteem in which the family is held was portrayed by the large crowd in attendance at the servces. The pallbearers were Louis and Berniece Lybbert, Lola Manwaring and Blaine Goodrich. The quartet rendered the closing song "Lead Me Gently Home." The benediction was offered by Fuller Remington. Interment was in the Vernal Cemetery with Harold Ludell dedicating the grave.
