Funeral Services Set in Roosevelt.

ROOSEVELT -- Sylvia Ann Hancock Goodrich, age 87, died here September 13, 1982.

Born May 1, 1885, in Washington County, Utah to Levison and Emily Almira Mangum Hancock. Married Alfred Slade Goodrich August 21, 1912 in Vernal. The marriage was solemnized in the Idaho Falls LDS Temple, August 12, 1961.

The Hancock family moved to this area in 1905, an area that had been formerly an Indian reservation. Sylvia was the first white girl to move into this area. The family built their first home in Hancock Cove, an area named after the Hancock family.

Survivors include four sons, Rulon L., of Vernal; Evan F. and Norman, both of Roosevelt and Boyd of Springville; 22 grandchildren, 47 great-grandchildren, and one great-great-grandchild and a sister, Velva Gagon, of Murray.

Funeral services will be held Thursday, September 16, at 1 p.m., at the Altamont LDS Ward Chapel. Friends may call Wednesday from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Olpin-Hullinger Mortuary here, and Thursday one hour prior to services at the church. Burial will be in the Bluebell Cemetery.
